STORIES FROM ACROSS PENNSYLVANIA

Shannon B., Emmaus

Shannon supports unions and is a member of the Communications Workers of America. He is unhappy with rapid inflation but doesn't think the federal government can do much more than they're already doing to curb it right now.



Chris P., Allentown

Chris feels that no candidate is perfect, but he really likes John Fetterman, saying: "He is an everyday guy trying to protect the everyday guy."



Sierra R., Wilkinsburg

Sierra is a child care worker whose job was paused during COVID-19. She's back at work now, but still struggling to get back on her feet, and thinks the government should do more to help people.



Chylia H., Whitehall

Chylia is sick of health care price gouging and feels prices in general are far too high. She also thinks property taxes are too high for people with a fixed income, like herself, and supports funding education with a state income tax.



Jesse V., Breinigsville

Jesse wants health care costs lowered and thinks Josh Shapiro is the only gubernatorial candidate who would even attempt it. He also believes that higher education should be more accessible and affordable.



Michael D., Bloomfield

Michael is a former Republican, but the party has taken some turns he can't support. Michael said he thinks Dr. Oz is an "opportunist" and Doug Mastriano is "dangerous."

Michael B., Allentown

Michael is a lifelong Republican, but he said he won't be supporting any Trump-backed Republicans in the upcoming midterms, is not going to vote for Oz or Mastriano, and felt it was sad to see so many candidates endorsing anti-worker policies.

Don A., Pittsburgh

Don said he likes that Josh Shapiro will protect unions and won't turn Pennsylvania into a "right-to-work" state. "Unions protect good employees from bad management," he said.
