
As we've talked with voters across the Commonwealth, we're hearing a lot about Social Security, Medicare, and other earned benefits.

This year's election will have significant consequences for Medicare and Social Security.

The debate, illustrated in the U.S. Senate race between Lt. Gov. John Fetterman and former TV personality Dr. Mehmet Oz, centers on whether to expand and improve Medicare and Social Security or potentially privatize and sunset these programs under proposals such as "Medicare Advantage," which would allow insurance companies to raise premiums and deny care to people with preexisting conditions.

John Fetterman wants to improve Medicare and Social Security. Dr. Oz is in favor of privatizing Medicare.

JOHN FETTERMAN


BOTTOM LINE

John Fetterman believes health care—including access to reproductive health care—is a fundamental right, as basic as housing, food, and education. As Lt. Governor, Fetterman worked with Governor Wolf to protect high-quality health care for 2.2 million Pennsylvanians.

- Vowed to protect Social Security, calling it a “critical lifeline for PA’s seniors,” and believes the ability to retire with dignity is “at the heart of the basic American bargain.”¹
- Believes health care is a “basic, fundamental human right, no different than food or shelter.”²
- Has condemned calls from Senate Republicans to eliminate Social Security and Medicare as federal entitlement programs.³
- Believes we must lower the Medicare eligibility age to 60 while expanding coverage to include vision, hearing, and dental.⁴

BOTTOM LINE

Former TV personality Dr. Mehmet Oz has proposed privatizing Medicare, which would allow insurance companies to raise premiums and deny care to people with preexisting conditions. He’s also promised to support the schemes of some Republican senators that could eliminate Social Security and jeopardize benefits for millions of seniors.

- Proposed privatizing Medicare and expanding “Medicare Advantage” programs, which are known to deny claims that would be covered under normal Medicare.⁵
- Proposes raising payroll taxes to 20%, passing the cost of health care onto working people.⁶
- Wants to give insurance companies more power to raise premiums and deny coverage.⁷
- Voiced support for a plan that could eliminate Social Security and Medicare, while allowing Wall Street to make billions off of beneficiaries and raising taxes to 35% on Pennsylvanians.⁸
- According to financial disclosures, Oz and his wife own up to \$600,000 in stock for health care companies, which would stand to benefit from privatized Medicare.⁹
